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Dear P802.16f Balloting Group:

Thank you for your participation in the Sponsor Ballot Recirculation of P802.16f/D4, which ran from 31 May to 15 June 2005. A Ballot Resolution Committee apppointed by the IEEE 802.16 Working Group met on 20-21 June 2005 to address the comments received. Including one post-ballot indication of a vote change, the current vote status is 74 Approve and 6 Disapprove, for an approval ratio of 92.5%. A list of the Disapprove voters is included as an Annex to this letter.

We are requesting that the IEEE Balloting Center initiate a fifteen-day recirculation of the new draft P802.16f/D5 (file *P80216f_D5.pdf*) along with a marked-up a copy (file *P80216f_D5delta.pdf*) with changes indicated. In addition, we are including a report of the Technical Required comments received in the latest recirculation as document IEEE 802.16-05/041 (file 80216-05_041.pdf). Note that editorial comments and comments whose resolution has been explicitly accepted are not included. For a complete set of comments and resolutions from the latest recirculation, please see the hyperlinked document IEEE 802.16-05/036r4. Also, you may wish to see the remaining unresolved technical comments from the prior ballot round; these are in IEEE 802.16-05/022r7 (regarding D3). In some cases, the comments and resolutions refer to document numbers of the form C802.16f-05/ijk. These documents are available at http://ieee802.org/16/netman.

Please take this opportunity to review the material. You are not obligated to reply; if you do not, your current vote will stand. Based on the changes to the draft or on the Disapprove comments and responses, you may change your vote and/or submit additional comments. If you wish to re-vote or comment, please keep the deadline in mind. Instructions have been provided by the IEEE Balloting Center.

If you have voted Disapprove, I urge you to review the comment resolutions and let us know which, if any, of your comments have been satisfactorily resolved. If you choose to cast an Approve vote, we will assume that all of them are resolved to your satisfaction.
