Check-out: 12:00 p.m.

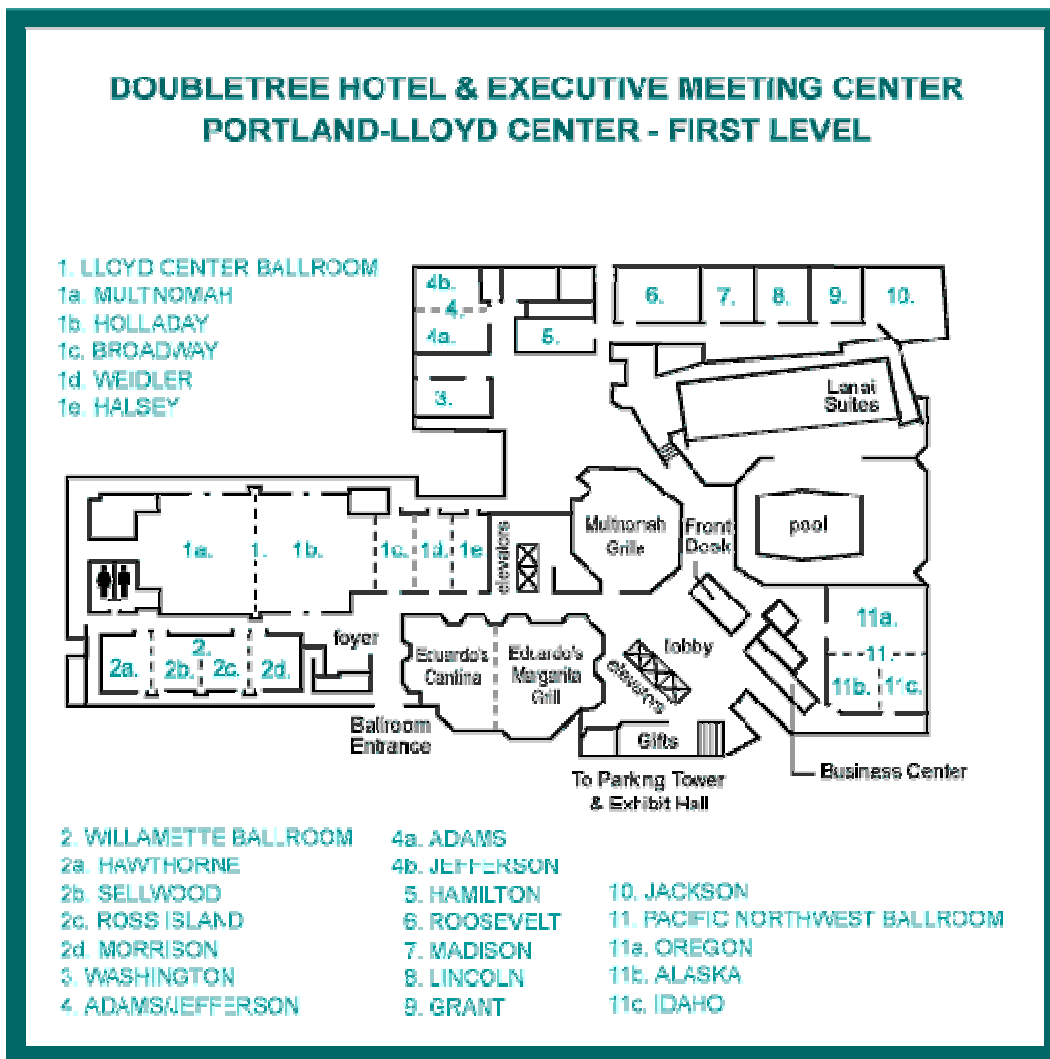


Meeting Room Locations

Transportation Information

Portland, Oregon Airport transportation options to or from the hotel:

From Airport:

Distance from Hotel: 7 miles

Drive Time: 15 Minutes

Directions from Airport: Follow Airport way to I-205 South. Then take I-84 West, go approximately 5 miles to exit 1 Lloyd Blvd. Go to the second light off of the exit and take a right. Go 1 and 1/2 blocks and Lloyd Center is on the left.

Directions:

In the airport, follow the signs to the MAX Light Rail near baggage claim. Board the MAX and get off at the Lloyd Center / NE 11th Ave station. The Doubletree Hotel is on 11th Avenue and Multnomah. MAX Light Rail trains run every 15 minutes every day between 4:30 a.m. and midnight.

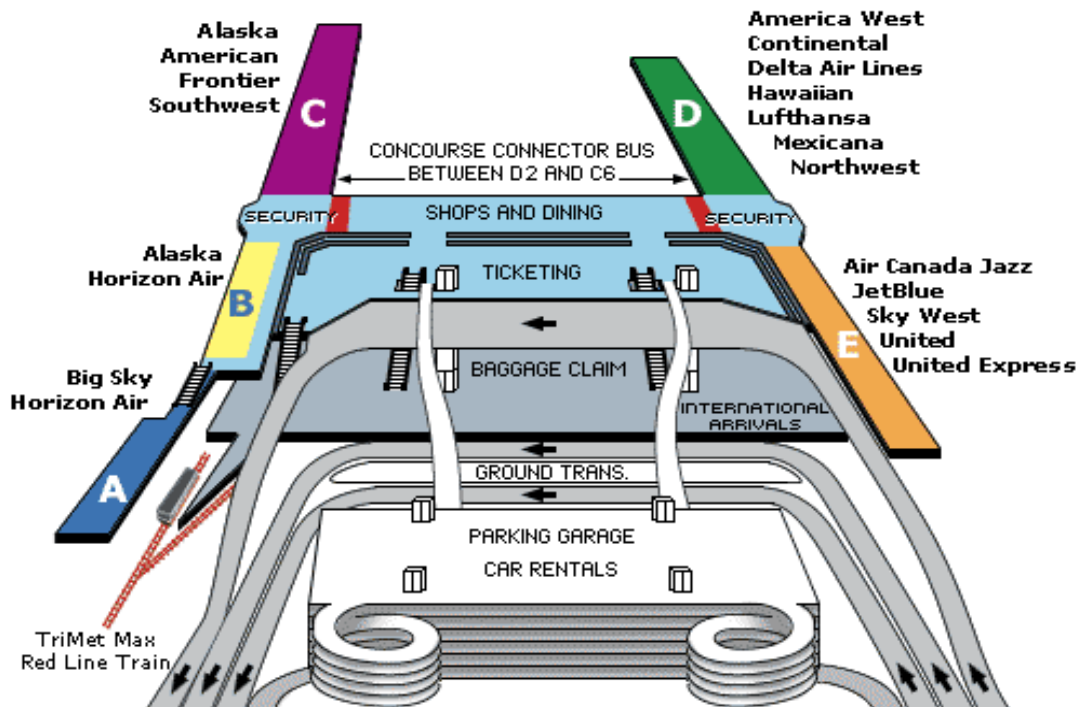
Ground Transportation Center

Direct International to PDX

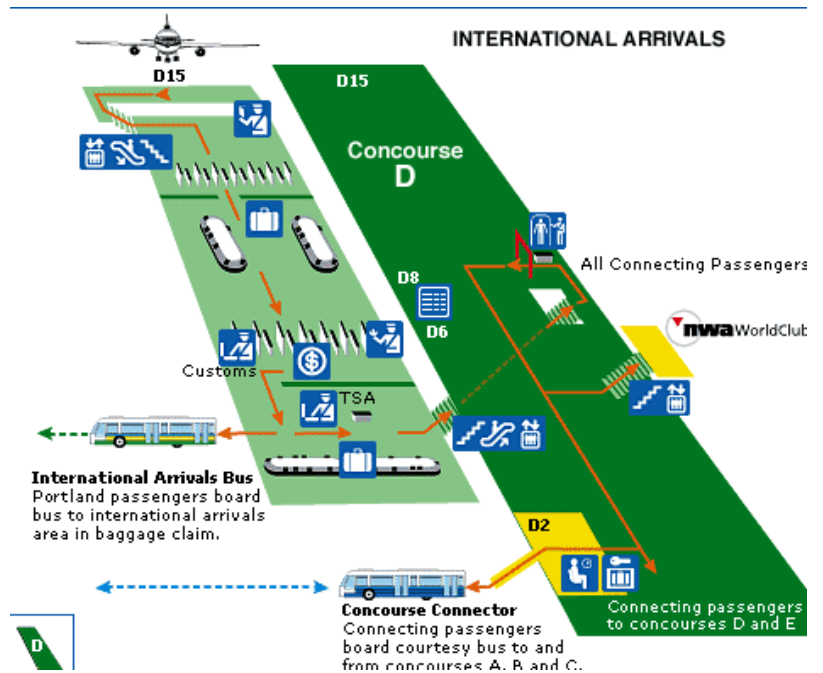
After arriving at PDX, passengers will be directed to Passport Control. As an arriving passenger, you will be required to provide international documentation, such as a passport, and declare any items of value. The Inspections Program is responsible for ensuring that individuals entering the U.S. by land, air or sea, at any port of entry, are eligible to do so under U.S. immigration law. 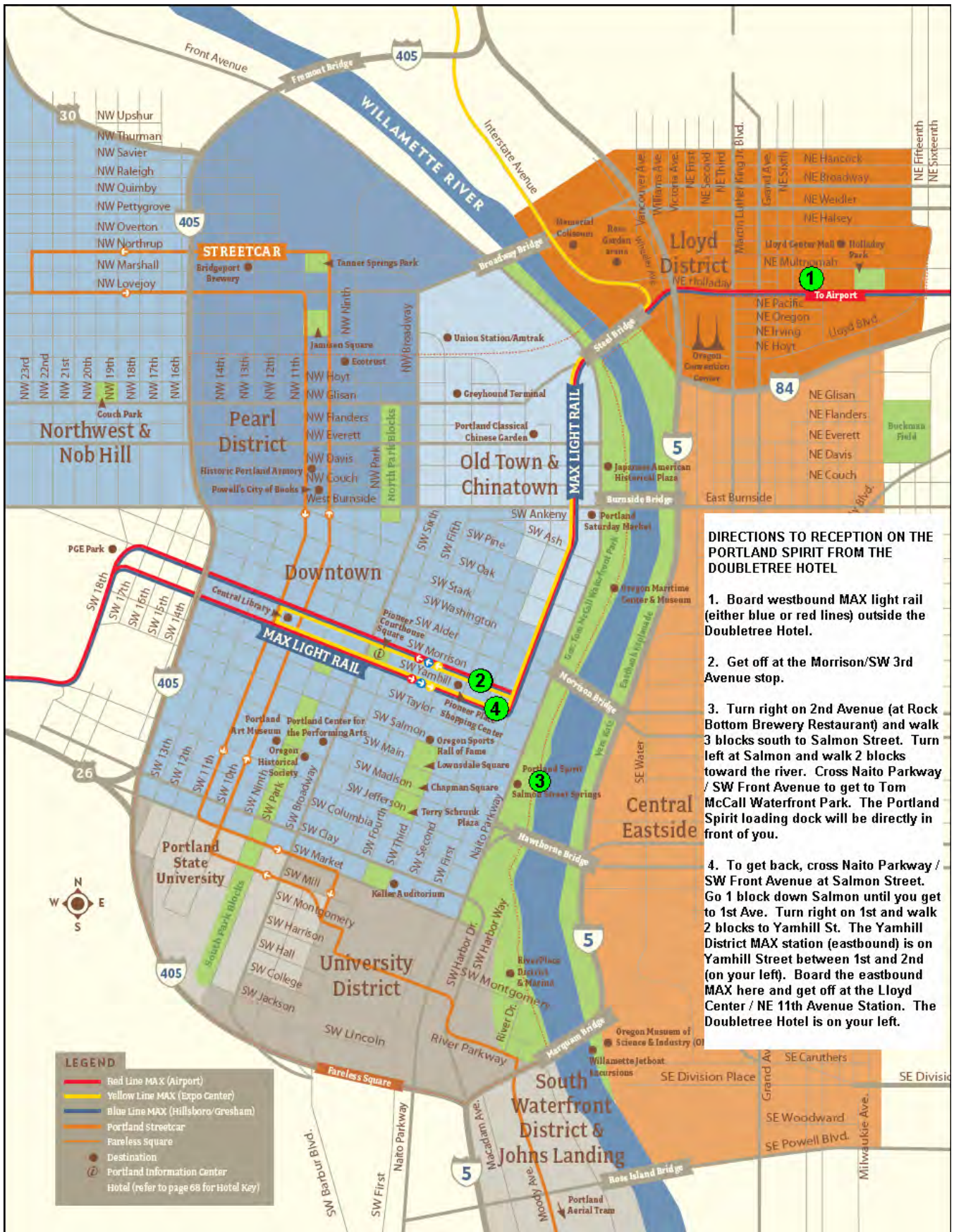
Reception on the Portland Spirit

6:30-9:30pm

Wednesday evening, a reception for all attendees will be held on the Portland Spirit from 6:30-9:30pm which will include dinner, drinks, and entertainment. Please plan to take the MAX Light Rail system to the boat dock by following the directions below. You must plan to be onboard the boat no later than 6:50pm. The boat will leave promptly at 7:00pm. Please use the map directions as well for your return back to the hotel.

**** MAX Light Rail Fareless Square ****

All trips that begin and end within Fareless Square are free—all day, every day. Fareless Square includes all the MAX stations between the Lloyd Center and SW 10th Avenue (See map on next page). Because of this, fare is not required to ride the MAX from the Doubletree Hotel to the Reception on the Portland Spirit!



DIRECTIONS TO RECEPTION ON THE PORTLAND SPIRIT FROM THE DOUBLETREE HOTEL

1. Board westbound MAX light rail (either blue or red lines) outside the Doubletree Hotel.
2. Get off at the Morrison/SW 3rd Avenue stop.
3. Turn right on 2nd Avenue (at Rock Bottom Brewery Restaurant) and walk 3 blocks south to Salmon Street. Turn left at Salmon and walk 2 blocks toward the river. Cross Naito Parkway / SW Front Avenue to get to Tom McCall Waterfront Park. The Portland Spirit loading dock will be directly in front of you.
4. To get back, cross Naito Parkway / SW Front Avenue at Salmon Street. Go 1 block down Salmon until you get to 1st Ave. Turn right on 1st and walk 2 blocks to Yamhill St. The Yamhill District MAX station (eastbound) is on Yamhill Street between 1st and 2nd (on your left). Board the eastbound MAX here and get off at the Lloyd Center / NE 11th Avenue Station. The Doubletree Hotel is on your left.
