1. Introduction

With relay station introduced, some configuration parameters specific for normal operation of RSs may be required. There are some examples, such as, ranging back-off, radio environment report threshold, HARQ related parameters, and so on. This contribution suggests introducing a message dedicated to broadcast configuration parameters specific for RS operation.

2. Introduction of RS configuration description management messages

In fact, 802.16e DCD and UCD massages can be modified to include those new configurations. However, there are following disadvantages using DCD/UCD for this purpose:

- The DCD/UCD would include new TLVs which are not related to the operation of 802.16e MSs. It is not efficient for a MS to decode a lengthy DCD/UCD message
- In addition, the change/update of MS related configuration and that of RS related configuration are not synchronized. Even though a DCD/UCD may only contain updated RS related configuration parameters, an MS has to decode this message.

In this contribution, we suggest to introduce RS configuration description message RS-CD management message to enable a MR-BS to broadcast RS specific configuration parameters to RSs only.

The RS-CD message includes configuration parameters for both DL and UL.
