I am writing in regards to submission 8F/1065 http://www.itu.int/md/R03-WP8F-C-1065, which was recently made by IEEE to ITU-R Working Party 8F.

§1 of Annex 1 of Resolution ITU-R 1-4 indicates that "... any Radiocommunication Sector Member organization putting forward a proposal for recommendation should, from the outset, draw the attention of the Director of the Radiocommunication Bureau to any known patent or to any known pending patent application, either their own or of other organizations..."

Contribution 8F/1065 is based on IEEE Std 802.16. The IEEE Standards Association (IEEE-SA), as a standards developing organization, maintains a patent policy applicable to the development of its standards. The IEEE-SA patent policy is consistent with the ANSI patent policy and is described in Clause 6 of the IEEE-SA Standards Board Bylaws http://standards.ieee.org/guides/bylaws/sect6-7.html.
