


Figure 44—Maximum time relevance of DL-MAP and UL-MAP(TDD)




Figure 46—Maximum time relevance of DL-MAP and UL-MAP (FDD)




Figure 46—Maximum time relevance of DL-MAP and UL-MAP (FDD)
