Progress Update

- We are in **Task Force** review. The entire document will be in scope for D1.2
 - Reminder: Scope opens again at the start of Working Group ballot and again at the start of IEEE SA ballot
- Our Goal right now: Get to Working Group ballot in a prudent, expedient manner
 - The document "must be complete with no open technical issues" (no TBDs)
- To resolve against D1.1, there are
 - ~152 electrical related comments
 - The CRG closed 1/3rd of electrical related TBDs during D1.0 comment resolution
 - Optics: ~112 optical related comments
 - Logic: ~52 logic comments
- Resolving <u>foundational TBDs</u> in this review cycle will let us see what issues remain and enable subsequent analysis/discussion to close them
 - May identify additional specification work items
- There was strong consensus in the Task Force for an "optimistic" schedule

TF Leadership Intent

- Conclude all D1.1 comment resolution by the end of the IEEE 802.3 September interim meeting
 - Time is **very** limited
 - All comments may not be considered, as per the Task Force D1.1 review announcement

Comment Resolution Approach

- Prioritization of comment closure (highest to lowest):
 - Close foundational & pivotal TBDs
 - Are there values or remedies that have sufficient consensus to use as a starting point? (Adopt now and refine in future drafts)
 - Unblock
 - Address known gaps and major errors in the specification with solutions
 - Changes to existing values
 - Strongly supported consensus presentations take priority
 - An acceptable justification for rejection is "The CRG cannot come to a consensus to make changes necessary to address the comment"

Presentations Approach

- There were 40+ presentation requests for the September interim meeting
- TF leadership will be limiting presentation review to 5-7, maybe 10 minutes to maximize comment resolution time
 - A message was sent to the reflector encouraging all participants to review posted presentations beforehand
- All presenters were asked to focus their presentation time on the key aspects of their presentation
 - Including any updates, if any
- Q&A will be managed as appropriate for the topic and current progress of the comment resolution
