Mr. Law discussed the meeting attendance credit change at the May 2024 interim meeting series. From the May 2024 interim meeting series onwards, the IEEE 802.3 Ethernet Working Group moved from a meeting-based IMAT configuration to a 4-slot per day IMAT configuration. This change aligned the IEEE 802.3 Working Groups with the other IEEE 802 LMSC Working Groups. In addition, it removed the need to post-process IMAT information after interims and plenaries and resulted in IMAT displaying the correct attendance percentages.
